Why I Invite People To Run Trains By Kirk DePeel

I was about seven when my dad took me to my first, and only, train show with him. The show was located in a huge two-story department store whose name escapes me today. I remember walking in and seeing the layouts sprawled out everywhere. The sights and sounds of trains chugging and smoking while pulling long strings of brightly colored cars over bridges and through tunnels are burned in my memory. It was pure heaven to a young boy in love with trains.

Most of the layouts were American Flyer with some Lionel setups mixed in for good measure. There was one HO layout on display, this being before HO would become popular and overtake both scales. I remember someone asking one of the members if he thought HO would ever become as popular as American Flyer. The guy laughed and said it was a passing phase and nothing more. Funny, but years later I heard someone say the same thing about N-scale. But I digress.

Now my dad was a model railroader although he hadn't the time (or patience) for the hobby. It was only after his death that I learned of his love for trains, both real and models. He was one of these people who was right on the edge. If someone had offered to let him operate one of their layouts that day, I think he would have dove into the hobby headfirst. Instead he walked away not knowing the true fun and enjoyment of building and operating his own layout.

Since joining this club, my son and I have always made it a point to invite people at the show to run our trains for just that reason. We wanted to get people interested in the hobby and, hopefully, join our club. Unfortunately, N-gauge is not the best scale when it comes to shuffling cars around. Don's switching layout served that purpose wonderfully, but we needed something more spread out

and detailed.

The three HO yard modules on the other hand had seen better days and were screaming to be redone. Their use was limited to holding cars since any switching involved using one of the two main lines. The joints between the modules had become warped making the tracks uneven, which resulted in derailments. The wiring had never been completed, and there were dead spots in areas. And most of the buildings that had been on the yard were gone, causing gaps in the scenery.

So a group of us (Walter, Dave R., Kenny, Jason, myself, and others) looked at revamping the yard. It was decided a switching layout would gives us the biggest bang for our buck. Not only would it increase the operational interest, but also it would allow us to add prototypical operation in the form of an interchange track. Interchange tracks are more common than flat yards yet they are seldom modeled.

After playing with the track plan, we actually were able to create two separate interchange tracks. Not only that, but the two main interchange tracks actually hold more cars than the old yard it replaces. Plus, with a new fourth module, we were able to add a number of industries and greater interest to switching.

While work progresses we will continue to seek out advice, suggestions, and ideas to make the switching layout more interesting. It is our goal to have the layout wired and running by Railfair. It is our hope that we will have a large part of it scenic for the show. This is a club project, so have fun and get involved.
